

### What are the Odds of Christ Fulfilling only 8 of the “300” Prophecies about Him in the Bible

The Bible is full of prophecies. In [Science Speaks](#), Dr. Peter Stoner looks at the probability that one man, Jesus Christ, could have fulfilled even 8 of the 300 prophecies that pertain to Him in the Bible. Let’s look at these eight prophecies from the Old Testament pertaining to Christ, their fulfillment by Christ in the New Testament, the probability of one man fulfilling each prophecy, and the sum of one man fulfilling all eight prophecies.

<u>Old Testament Prophecy</u>	<u>New Testament Fulfillment</u>	<u>Probability</u>
<u>Christ was to be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2)</u>	<u>Christ was born in Bethlehen (Matt 2:4-6)</u>	<u>1 in 280,000</u>
<u>There will be a Forerunner of Christ (Malachi 3:1)</u>	<u>Forerunner of Christ (Mk 1:2-8) John the Baptist</u>	<u>1 in 1,000</u>
<u>Christ to enter Jerusalem on a donkey (Zech 9:9)</u>	<u>Christ entered Jerusalem on a donkey (Matt 21:4-11)</u>	<u>1 in 100</u>
<u>Christ to be betrayed by a friend (Psalm 41:9)</u>	<u>Judas “a friend” betrayed Christ (Luke 22:21)</u>	<u>1 in 1,000</u>
<u>Christ to be betrayed for 30 pcs of silver (Zech 11:12)</u>	<u>Christ was sold out for 30 pcs of silver (Matt 26:15)</u>	<u>1 in 1,000</u>
<u>30 pcs of silver used to buy a potter’s field (Zech 11:13)</u>	<u>30 pcs of silver were used to buy a potters field (Mark: 27:3-10)</u>	<u>1 in 100,000</u>
<u>Christ kept silent during His false trial (Isaiah 53:7)</u>	<u>Christ kept silent when questioned (Mk 14:60-61)</u>	<u>1 in 1,000</u>
<u>Christ crucified – “they pierced my hands and my feet” (Psalm 22:16)</u>	<u>Christ was crucified - His hands and feet were pierced (John 19:17,18)</u>	<u>1 in 10,000</u>

To answer the question, what is the probability of one man fulfilling all eight prophecies? The Principal of probability is applied..Therefore, multiplying all eight probabilities together for simplicity sake 1 x 10 to the 28<sup>th</sup> pwr or 1 in 10,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000. Remember that’s only 8 of the 300 prophecies about Christ in the Bible. Fulfilled prophecy is powerful evidence that the Bible is devine rather than human in origin. Close to 1/3 of the bible is prophecy including the 300 prophecies and implications about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. There is no other book like this in the world.
