Romans 8:38-39 KJV “For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, 39 Nor height, nor

*depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in **Christ Jesus our Lord***"

Paul was also facing attacks from false brethren and he gave the Corinthian Church, some idea of what he was going through in a rebuttal to the attackers, in the below scripture verses.

2nd Corinthians 11:24-27 KJV *"Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one. 25 Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; 26 In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; 27 In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness."*

But Paul experienced unspeakable joys as well, as he was taken up to the third Heaven which the below Scriptures indicate. An interesting thing about this Heavenly visit is that he could not determine if he was in his earthly body or if he was in a spiritual body. Not likely that he was in his earthly body (**just a guess**) and if he was in his spiritual body this means he could not tell the difference. Which means (**again just a guess**) that if we were to die and be on our way to Heaven it would also appear to us like nothing had changed as far as recognizing our body is concerned. Which certainly is a nice thought for us but is speculation on my part. However, there is speculation that Paul actually died (when he was stoned) and that this was when he was taken up to the third Heaven.

2nd Corinthians 12:1-4 KJV "It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord. 2 I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven. 3 And I knew such a man, (whether in the body, or out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) 4 How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter."

A Couple of Videos to Help us Understand the Timeline in the Bible and who is Being Spoken to

Whether to (us the Gentiles) or to (Israel) or to the (Little Flock Church) made up of the 12 Apostles and the Jewish remnant followers of Christ. Who believed that Jesus Christ was their Messiah and that they would soon be going into the 7-year tribulation > but this program was interrupted when the Israel Sanhedrin religious leaders rejected their last chance to accept Jesus Christ as their Messiah and King, at the stoning of Stephen in **Acts 7**. Then **(Israel) was set aside** and **God introduced "Grace" without the works of the Law, through Paul** the Apostle to the Gentiles in **Acts 9**. And during this

Grace period that we are in, **both Jew and Gentile now come to God the same way: by Faith alone in Christ alone. Exclusively, without any** works of the Law. Then after the Rapture of the Church “the Body of Christ,” **God will continue with Israel and their program**, which is faith plus works. God **will fulfill all the promises He made to them**. Starting with the 7-year Tribulation then, Christ’s return after the 7-year Tribulation and the 1,000-year Millennium on earth to follow where the Jews will be a Nation of holy Priests.
