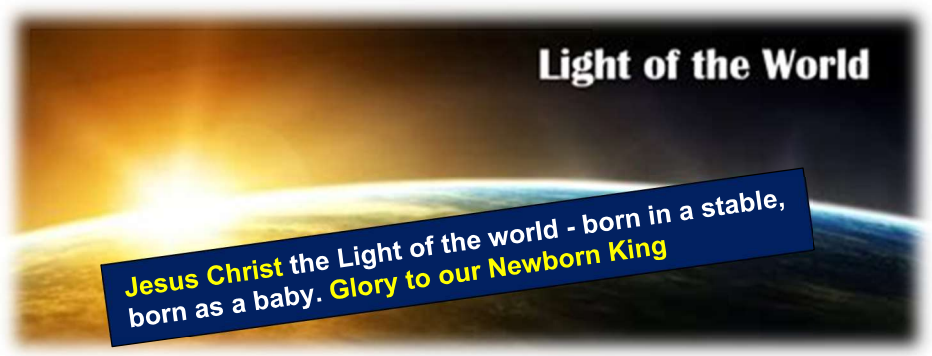

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Topic: >> God the Word took on a Human Nature as well

The incarnation of Jesus means that while remaining God, He also took upon a new nature – a human nature. The **Incarnation** was the **uniting** of the **Divine** and the **human** into one being.

Jesus Christ was fully God and fully human. In becoming a human being **Jesus laid aside** His heavenly glory to live among us.

If you wish to know **what God is like** you need to go no further than to **look at Jesus**. Note the following verse.

John 1:14 KJV “And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.”

John 1:1 KJV “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

Jesus Christ was the Word, and the Word was God in the beginning

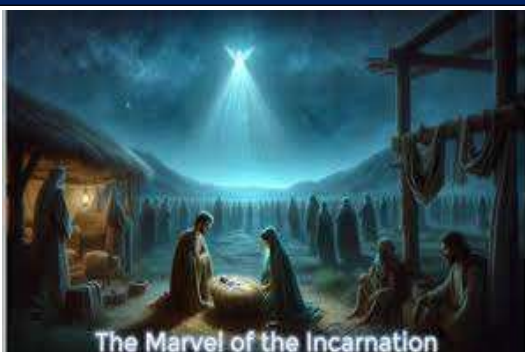
Why did God the Word become a human too

- >To do the Father’s will (“thy will be done”)
- >To proclaim the good news of the Gospel to the poor and the rich
- >To deliver the Gospel message that in Christ we may be set free from every oppression.
- >To minister the freedom Christ brings to those imprisoned by sin, addictions, and bondages.
- >To bring Christ’s divine healing to the sick, the infirm, and the blind.
- > To tell them about the Kingdom of God, that there is a loving, almighty God who rules this earth and entire universe.
- > To lead lost sinners from death and Hell to life in Christ
- > To seek the lost and tell them about the Savior Jesus Christ
- > To live as Jesus did on earth – to serve and to give

To tell hopeless people of God’s desire to show them His Favor

Ephesians 1:13 KJV “In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,”

The “Moment” we believe & trust Jesus Christ paid for our sins we are “SEALED” with the Holy Spirit



When Christians call the Savior “Jesus Christ,” they are really saying “**Jesus the Messiah**” or “**Jesus the Anointed One**.” Christ is not His last name! **Christ is His title**, meaning He was sent by God, **divinely appointed**, to be the **Deliverer and King** of His people. It wasn’t until **after Jesus’ resurrection** that the **12 disciples’ eyes** were fully opened to the meaning of the Old Testament **prophecies** regarding the **Messiah**, and that **Jesus was indeed the Anointed One**.
